OSCEOLA WATER BOARD May 7, 2020

The Osceola Water Board met for the regularly scheduled meeting via telephone on Thursday, May 7, 2020 at 5:30 P.M. This being the time and place as legally posted, the meeting was called to order by Chairman Alisha Kale with the following Board Members present: Larry Bishop, Mark Binning and James Kimball. Also present were new board member (observing only – not under oath of office) Sara O'Hair, Superintendent Brandon Patterson, Utility Office Manager Carrie Benda, Water Works Foreman Royce Robertson and State Representative Joel Fry.

Board member Binning motioned to approve the agenda as presented and Bishop seconded the motion.

State Representative Joel Fry was invited to the board by Vice-Chair Larry Bishop to speak on behalf of state funding that may be available to the local municipalities. Board member Bishop spoke of his concern regarding the number of shutoffs and revenue the utility is losing due to COVID-19.

Water Superintendent asked the board's direction of how to proceed with item #4, regarding water meters for 2315 N. Main St. as Mr. Kenoyer had not called in yet. Board member Bishop motioned to move the agenda item to after item #9 to allow additional time for Mr. Kenoyer to join and Kimball seconded the motion.

Water Superintendent Brandon Patterson opened the discussion regarding five year RMP Update by updating the board regarding the process we are required to follow regarding an EPA update on audit, assessment, training and paperwork submittals. Mr. Patterson presented two bids received. The first bid was from HDR Engineering in the amount of \$14,500 and the second from Municipal H2O for a cost of \$7,200. After discussion, board member Bishop motioned the awarding of the contract to Municipal H2O for a cost of \$7,200 and Binning seconded the motion. Roll call of the vote was:

Water Superintendent Brandon Patterson opened the discussion regarding SCBA at water treatment plant. Mr. Patterson stated that the items we currently have need updated and gave a cost of items not to exceed \$3,521.97. After discussion, board member Kimball motioned to move forward with the purchase of the SCBA equipment for the water treatment plant and Binning seconded the motion.

Nays: None Motion Passed Water Superintendent Report: Brandon Patterson shared with the board projects that are being worked on including, seeding of spots from main repairs, lagoon cleaning, center tower repairs, plant clarifier repairs, new home construction on South Kossuth Street and discussed the new development by the nursing home. Continuing on, Mr. Patterson spoke of the office continuing to be closed to the public and discussed the process that is working to allow staff to continue to help customers with payments and turn on/off situations. Mr. Patterson completed his report by giving the board an update of the lake treating process, carbon changeout completed as well as the consumer confidence report being completed and being available online.

Chairman Kale presented the consent agenda. Board member Kimball motioned to approve the consent agenda as presented and Binning seconded the motion. The consent agenda included the Aging Report reflecting an outstanding balance of \$28,857.72 on all utility services, YTD Budget Report, minutes from the meetings held on April 2, 2020 as well as the following Bills and Claims:
